

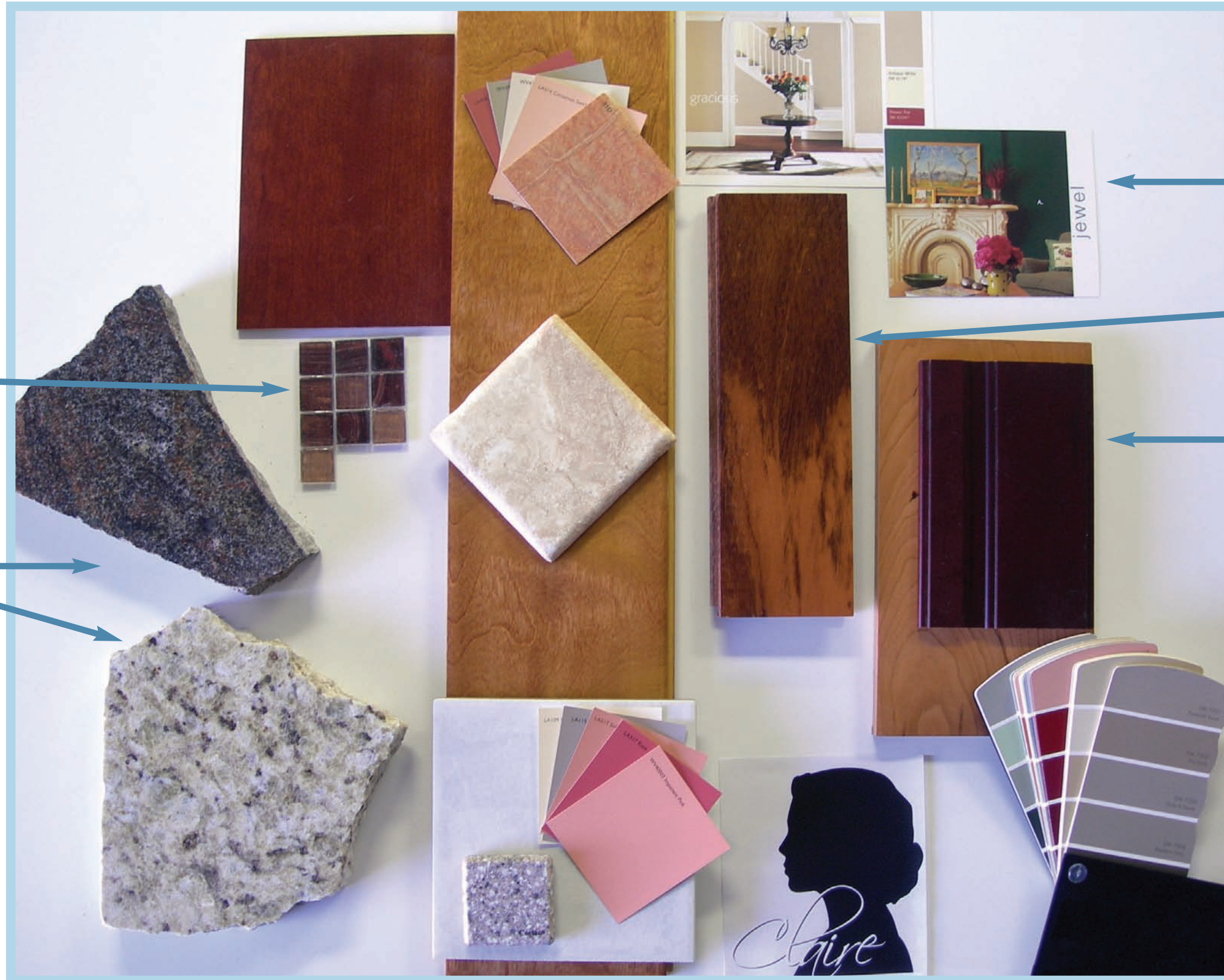
# Claire

Think "Transitional" or Showcase"  
Key Words: *Stylish, romantic and elegant*

**Baseboard/  
Crown Molding**  
– White or rich wood  
that matches flooring –  
larger than standard

**Backsplash**  
– tumbled marble,  
travertine or glass  
accents mixed to form  
a "Wow" design

**Countertops**  
– granite with flow  
and movement that's  
rich in color changes  
or a Corian or Quartz  
that's unique



**Fireplace surround**  
– travertine, stone or  
detailed, ornate wood

**Flooring**  
– Rich Hickory, Tiger  
or Bamboo

**Cabinetry**  
– Cherry, Glazed Ivory  
or a mixture with  
large molding and  
staggered heights

**Appliances**  
– Copper, Ivory  
or Stainless

**Walls**  
– Rich, warm colors  
with faux highlights and  
complimentary accents

Think "Traditional" and Functional

Key Words: *Practical, warm and inviting*



## Appliances

– Black, Ivory or White preferred over Stainless

## Walls

– Elise prefers relaxing colors with complementary accents. Soft yellows or warm beiges in the kitchen, blues or greens in the GR or Bedrooms.

## Backsplash/Countertop

– a natural stone that would compliment the Quartz or Formica countertops. A traditional pattern with tile pieces would work nicely in this setting with something creative over the stovetop

## Cabinetry

– Elise prefers the warmth that Cherry or Birch brings with a medium to dark stain. A combination of an Oak for the box and black stained door fronts could add a touch of flair to a very traditional setting.

## Flooring

– A mixture of tile or wood in the kitchen and entry and hallways. Carpet that carries the color scheme in the bedrooms but mainly neutrals.

# Maggie

Think "Eclectic" and easy maintenance

Key Words: *Comfortable, inviting and mix n' match*

## Countertops

– low maintenance  
Formica works well as does Quartz, Silestone and some may crossover to a granite if neutral in appearance and uniform in pattern

## Cabinetry

– Natural Birch or Maple work well with simple lines and hardware

## Walls

– prefer the lighter palette with just enough color to accent

## Appliances

– White, Ivory or Stainless

## Backsplash

– neutral or natural stone in the neutral palette

## Baseboard/ Crown Molding

– Wood at standard height

## Flooring

– Natural Oak or Hickory in kitchen and hallways. Carpet of varying colors and style in bedrooms.

A built in Murphy Bed would be an excellent option for the Maggie's that have infrequent visitors and hobbies that could be set up in the same space



# Margo

Think “Urban-like” and “Easy sophistication”  
Key Words: *Edgy, trendy and simple lines*

## Walls

– Neutral but Margo loves a splash of color somewhere. It may be a soffit, an entire room or accent areas but the main walls should stay within the same palette of the neutrals that tie in with the tile or backsplash.

## Hardware

– Contemporary – have fun with this element

## Flooring

– Cutting edge is fun for Margo. Bamboo is an excellent choice, but tile, polished cement or Travertine also works if the pattern is simple. Neutral carpet in bedrooms.

## Baseboard

– neutral & standard size



## Cabinetry

– Natural Maple, sleek, simple with contemporary hardware.

## Backsplash

– Glass tiles come in varying sizes and reflect light beautifully a simple monotone tile is less expensive but can work with a contemporary look.

## Countertops

– Black is the trend for the countertops. There are many choices of granite which can be either polished or honed. Quartz or Corian are also options, if contemporary in color.

## Appliances

– Stainless Steel
